- 2. Scholarship will be awarded on the following criteria:
  - a. Student must reside in Nicollet or Sibley County
  - b. Family must be a Nicollet or Sibley County Corn or Soybean Growers member
  - c. Student activities in high school or college
  - d. Community activities
  - e. Scholarship will be awarded on a 2.0 GPA or higher after 1st semester of college
- 3. Short Essay on each topic (2-3 paragraphs)
  - a. What the student has accomplished being involved in agriculture
  - b. Future plans with his/her degree in agriculture
  - c. The future of corn and soybeans. You can talk about markets, uses, and technology advances and any research that you may find.
- 4. Nicollet/Sibley County Corn & Soybean Growers Board members will determine who will receive the \$1000 scholarships (Six scholarships will be awarded).
- 5. Scholarships are awarded once to a recipient, not renewable.
- 6. Family members can become a member of either organization and students can then become eligible for the scholarship program.
